

How to complete your camper's health profile

All participants must have their health profile completed. Located in the right-hand column are the different pages that need to be completed. Click on the name of one to begin, and answer all questions until that section is complete. When it is completed, the red circle will change to a green checkmark. Continue to the next section by selecting a section that has not been completed (a section with a red circle). You have finished the health profile once all sections are labeled with a green checkmark.

This form then needs to be uploaded to the site- You may scan or take a photo of the form with a smartphone, then upload the file. Click on the red box to upload. You may also email a copy of it to us, drop it off at our office, or have your pediatrician fax it to us (fax# (914)669-8460) and we will upload it for you.

****All medications brought to camp must match this form EXACTLY. No generic meds unless your doctor has written the prescription for generic. (ex. If your doctor prescribes Benadryl, we must have the Benadryl brand, not a generic). This is a Department of Health regulation. Thank you for your cooperation in this.**

All medication provided must match prescription EXACTLY. We cannot accept generic versions of medications unless explicitly written on the prescription by a doctor, as per the Westchester County Department of Health.



Immunizations


You have two options to input the participant's immunization records:

A. Enter each date manually from the drop-down menus for each type of immunization.
